Selection Event	2010 NZ Open Long Course Championships, Auckland, 5-10 April, 2010
Eligibility	<p>To be considered for selection, a swimmer must meet all of the following eligibility criteria:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A New Zealand citizen who is eligible to represent New Zealand in the Competition as per FINA General Rule 2 (GR2) 2. A registered member of Swimming New Zealand in good standing 3. Have signed a current Swimming New Zealand Athlete Agreement 4. Be available to fulfill the Team Commitments as outlined by SNZ Head Coach - Mark Regan ("Head Coach") at the selection event.
Team Commitments	<p>All swimmers must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Comply with the provisions of their SNZ Athletes Agreement at all times 2. Conform to SNZ requirements regarding team preparation 3. Make themselves available for all team activities designated by the General Manager of Performance and Pathways (GMPP) and the Head Coach

Performance Requirement

Criteria for selection for individual events:

To be selected for the 2010 Oceania Championships swimmers will:

Youth Team to Oceania Champs:

1. Gain automatic selection to the 2010 Oceania Championships if they are selected for the 2010 Junior Pan Pacific Championship team.
2. Record a qualifying time equal to or better than 800 FINA points (based on the document titled “FINA Point Scoring 2008 – Long Course 50m”) for all events except the 800m freestyle women’s and 1500m freestyle men’s which will be 850 FINA points (based on the document detailed above), at the selection event in the final of an Olympic event, and are 18 or under at the start date of the 2010 Oceania Championships, 21 June, 2010

Development Team:

1. Record a qualifying time equal to or better than 825 FINA points based on the document detailed above) for all events except the 800m freestyle women’s and 1500m freestyle men’s which will be 850 FINA points (based on the document detailed above), at the selection event in the final of an Olympic event and are over 18 at the start date of the 2010 Oceania Championships, 21 June, 2010

Non-Olympic events:

1. To qualify in a non-Olympic event swimmers are required to achieve 900 FINA points (based on the document detailed above) in the final of that event at the selection event.

Relay Selection:

1. Selections for relays will be done from within the total team and selection

	<p>to the relay event based on performances at the Oceania championships.</p> <p>Further Information:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Relay and other splits will not be considered for selection for an individual event nor for selection to relays. 2. Swimmers may swim extra events at the Oceania Championships, this on request to GMPP and the Head Coach and prioritised according to finishing position at the selection event. 3. Two swimmers per country are able to swim in the final at the Oceania Championships.
Team Size	Team size for individual events will be in accordance with the FINA rules. If the number of athletes meeting the performance criteria exceeds the FINA limit, the highest ranked swimmers who satisfy the selection criteria will be selected.
Notes	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Swimming New Zealand may amend these selection criteria at any time in its sole discretion by giving adequate notice to those swimmers who meet the eligibility criteria. 2. A swimmer may be selected if in the 12 months prior to the selection meet they: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) have met the Performance Requirement, but are unable to compete at the Nomination Event, due to extenuating circumstances which meet SNZ approval, b) have a top 16 world ranking in an Olympic event in the year prior to selection the following may be considered: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In the case of injury or illness, the swimmer is able to provide, in advance of the selection event, a medical certificate from the SNZ Medical Director. The medical certificate must indicate the current and future performance impact of the condition. -Selectors, in conjunction with the GM P&P may consider these circumstances for selection. <p>NB: Selection of a swimmer, as outlined in Note 3, will be subject to confirmation of their satisfactory return to training. This process to include a test (under legitimate competitive conditions - referee, starter, turn judges, electronic timing) in the event selected. This test to be performed by a designated date confirmed by GM P&P and SNZ Head Coach. A target time indicating satisfactory progress will be decided by the SNZ selectors, GM P&P and SNZ Head Coach and communicated to the swimmer by a designated date.</p>
